

## **Popular Sources**





#### **Author**

Not usually written by subject experts

#### **Audience**

- Inform a wide variety of readers about subjects of interest
- Typically do not contain original research
- Published and shared in various locations

#### **Features**

- May or may not have been edited or reviewed
- Typically do not include citations
- Tend to be shorter and more accessible

## Scholarly Sources





#### **Author**

- Written by experts in a field
  - Professors, researchers, government employees

#### **Audience**

- Provide others in the field with the most recent research and findings
- Typically published in academic journals

#### **Features**

- Undergo a rigorous peer review process
- Include citations
- Tend to be longer, use specialized language

## **Library Databases**

- E-research by discipline: all the databases and library resources recommended for a subject area
- Boolean searching
  - (and, or, not)
- Put words you want to keep together in quotes
  - Example: "Zombie apocalypse"
- Don't forget to use limiters!
  - (date published, subject, peer-reviewed, etc)
- Access issues? Chat with a librarian or email lib\_access@unc.edu.






